

**A.P.E.G.M.
HONORARY LIFE MEMBERSHIP**

PURPOSE

The granting of Honorary Life Membership (By-law Clause 7.1.3) is intended to recognize many years of meritorious service rendered to the Association or the profession.

Professional members in the honorary life membership category shall pay no annual dues and shall hold all the rights and privileges conferred on a professional engineer or a professional geoscientist by The Engineering and Geoscientific Professions Act and Association By-laws.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for nomination, a candidate shall:

- 1) Be registered as a professional engineer or geoscientist in the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of the Province of Manitoba;
- 2) Preferably have been registered as a professional engineer or professional geoscientist in Canada for not less than 35 years.

SELECTION CRITERIA

In rating candidates, consideration will be given to their continued leadership in the profession and in the community, to their outstanding achievements, and to the recognition they have achieved. Candidates will be rated primarily on the following criteria, using the percentage weightings shown in parentheses:

- 1) Years of Membership in APEGM - normally a minimum of 35 years;
- 2) Participation on Committees of A.P.E.G.M. (40%) - total duration and effectiveness;
- 3) Meritorious Service to the Profession (60%) - contributions to engineering literature; magnitude of engineering works completed; demonstrated pioneering achievement in the profession.

Honorary Life Membership may be granted only by a unanimous decision of Council.

NOMINATIONS

The names of potential recipients for review by the Awards Committee shall be solicited from the members of the Association, including members of Council and Committees.

To help ensure the quality and usefulness of their eventual submissions to the Committee;

- 1) Each nomination shall be submitted using an "Awards Nomination Form"
- 2) Using a format based on the selection criteria, each nomination shall be accompanied by a concise description of the work and achievements of the nominee for the award, together with such supporting evidence as the nominator may wish the judges to consider.

- 3) The nominator may provide additional attachments that help to demonstrate the nominee is qualified for the award. Such additional attachments shall be of limited length.

Names of potential recipients will be in the hands of the Awards Committee Chair normally by May 1 of each year.

Recommendations for the Award will be made to Council by the Awards Committee normally by June 1 of each year.

The Awards Committee has the authority after reviewing all applications for the award, to recommend to Council whether or not an award is to be given.

TIMING/PRESENTATION

The Award is normally presented at a meeting convened for the purpose of presenting awards, usually in conjunction with the Association's Annual General Meeting.
