## LIFE MEMBERSHIP

In accordance with the conditions of By-law 31 of the Association, Life Membership, Honoris Causa, may be granted by unanimous decision of Council to a member who has, in the opinion of Council, rendered meritorious service to the Association, who is no longer practising on a full-time basis as a Professional Engineer, and who has preferably been continuously a member for not less than 35 years and has attained the age of 65.

Jack Hoogstraten was registered in the Association in October, 1947 until February, 1958, at which time he transferred to Nova Scotia. In November, 1960 Mr. Hoogstraten transferred back to again become a member of this Association. He served on the A.P.E.M. Council for many years and was President for the 1955-56 term.

Raymond Swancoat Williams was registered in the Association in June, 1944.

In 1950, he unofficially worked at increasing membership in the A.P.E.M.

Mr. Williams was appointed Chairman of the Membership Committee in 1956,

1957 and 1958. Membership increased substantially during this period, with
the year 1956 showing the largest increase in the Association's history.
