LIFE MEMBERSHIP

In accordance with the conditions of By-law 31 of the Association, Life Membership, Honoris Causa, may be granted by unanimous decision of Council to a member who has, in the opinion of Council, rendered meritorious service to the Association, who is no longer practising on a full-time basis as a Professional Engineer, and who has preferably been continuously a member for not less than 35 years and has attained the age of 65.

Gordon Eldon McLure was registered with the Association on April 12, 1956. Mr. McLure has contributed many hours of his time to committee work through the years. He served on the membership Committee for one year, Consulting Engineers Committee for eleven years, Nominating Committee for one year and the Legislation Committee for six years of which two were as Chairman.

Robert Thompson Harland was registered with the Association on March 10, 1948. Mr. Harland served on the Plan for Unity Committee for two years, Legislation Committee for twelve years of which five were as Chairman, the Committee to Study the Professional Engineering Act for one year, Registration Procedures Committee for two years, Nominating Committee for two years, Budget Committee for one year, Awards Committee for seven years, and the Consulting Engineers Committee for one year. He was a member of Council for seven years and served one year as President.

Malcolm Needham Collison was registered with the Association on November 28, 1952. In 1956, when the Bulletin began publication, Mac was recruited as the reporter for Flin Flon. In its history the Bulletin has had no more faithful reporter. Mac's column appeared regularly for eighteen years, until he was moved from Flin Flon to Toronto. Mac dropped into the Association office regularly for a visit and attended many annual meetings. His dedication helped to establish a sense of rapport between members in Flin Flon and those in Winnipeg.
