The Transportation Engineering Branch is responsible for the planning, design, rehabilitation and construction of different highways, bridges and transportation infrastructure throughout Yukon. As Regional Program Manager, Bridges, you will be responsible for management of the design and construction of transportation infrastructure and related projects carried out by the Transportation Division. The focus of this position is bridges, but other types of transportation infrastructure may be included, depending on division priorities and capacity.

Essential Qualifications

- University degree in Engineering with a focus on civil or a related discipline;

- Registration and extensive Canadian experience as a Professional Engineer;
- Experience with highway bridge design and construction, including foundations and structures;
- Project management experience, including managing contracts, budgets, staff and consultants;
- Experience with highway bridge inspection, load analysis and development of solutions.
- Experience with Northern Canadian transportation would be an asset.

Desired Knowledge, Skills and Suitability

- Highly motivated professional with excellent technical, interpersonal, organizational and administrative skills;
- Ability to plan, organize and lead the design and construction of bridges and other structures related to transportation infrastructure projects;
- Ability to conduct load analysis in order to confirm if overweight vehicles can safely travel on the bridges;
- Ability to manage the bridge inspection and management program, the bridge inspection team, and the operation and maintenance program;
- Ability to collaborate within a team environment as well as work independently;
- Excellent research and writing skills;
- Ability to plan, develop, implement and evaluate projects;
- Ability to work with senior management, various stakeholders and government agencies;
- Demonstrated leadership competencies.
