CHARGE

The Appeal Committee of Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba (“EGM”) formulates the following charge dated July 25, 2025, as amended by the Investigation Committee of the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists on April 17, 2026.

MORR Transportation Consulting Ltd. (“MORR”), while registered as a professional engineering firm and Certificate of Authorization holder in the Province of Manitoba, displayed conduct which constitutes professional misconduct or unskilled practice in that:

In the course of providing engineering services respecting the preparation of a report dated March 2021, titled “Active Connectivity Transportation Plan” (the “**Report**”), MORR contravened ss. 26(3) and 26(6) of *The Engineering and Geoscientific Professions Act*, C.C.S.M. c. E120 (the “**Act**”) in violation of ss. 46(1)(a)(c)(d) and (e) thereof, and contravened Part 3.2.1 and Part 4 of the Authentication of Electronic and Hardcopy Documents Guideline (December 19, 2019) (the “**Guideline**”), by failing to authenticate the Report as required by the Act and Guideline.

Particulars

1. In or about March 2021, MORR prepared the Report for the Rural Municipality of East St. Paul (“**RM**”) to assess transportation connectivity development options in the RM;
2. The Report was made available to the public;
3. All members of EGM must, in accordance with the by-laws and the code of ethics authenticate, *inter alia*, every engineering or geoscientific report, plan, and other engineering or geoscientific document issued by the member pursuant to subsection 26(3) of the Act;
4. In the course of providing engineering services respecting the preparation of the Report, MORR failed to ensure that Professional Engineers under its employ authenticated the Report and ~~including by~~ failed ~~ing~~ to affix its stamp issued to it

as ~~or~~ Certificate of Authorization holder to the Report, in contravention of subsection 26(3) and 26(6) of the Act and Parts 3.2.1 and 4 of the Guideline;

Which failure constitutes professional misconduct or unskilled practice within the meaning of section 46(1) of the Act.
