2025 Salary and Compensation Survey Engineers/Geoscientists Members



Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba

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Key Findings

Respondent Characteristics

- More than three-quarters of respondents identify as male.
- The average age of those participating in the survey is 39 years, rising to 53 among advanced level engineers.
- One-quarter were born outside of Canada, rising to more than one-third among entry level engineers.
- Four in five say their principal work location is Winnipeg.
- One in 10 changed employers in 2024.
- Nearly all work full-time.
- Engineers/geoscientists have practiced an average of 14 years. Canadian experience averaged 12 years while experience gained outside of Canada averaged seven years.
- Most respondents are engineers. Only a handful identified as geoscientists.
- Around one in 10 belong to a union, particularly those working in the educational/non-profit sectors.

Employment Dimensions

- Overall, nearly seven in ten are employed by private companies, particularly Entry Level engineers (80%). Crown Corporations employ around one in five of Intermediate and Advanced Level engineers participating in the research.
- More than one in ten are employed in Consulting (22%), Utilities (16%) or Manufacturing (14%) with the rest employed in a wide variety of industries.
- Design (30%), Project Management (19%) and Management (16%) are the principal job functions mentioned most often by respondents.
- Four in ten work for firms with greater than 500 employees, with higher level engineers most likely to be employed by these larger firms.
- Overall, members' official work week is 38.57 hours with most typically working slightly more on average (40.61 hrs.).
- Two-thirds worked remotely or hybrid in 2024. This is most common among those working in the public sector and part-time workers (<40 hours/week). Among hybrid workers, around one-third of work is remote with two-thirds mostly done in the office.

Industry Sectors and Job Functions with Highest and Lowest Mean Base Salary

- Overall, the industry sectors with the highest mean base salaries are metals-primary (\$145,303) and heavy electrical (\$145,000).
- The sectors with the lowest mean base salaries remain agricultural/equipment (\$91,031) and biomedical (\$81,167).
- The job functions with the highest mean base salaries include management (\$140,686), and administrative services (\$130,633).
- The lowest paid job functions include production (\$83,578), quality assurance (\$90,996) and computer services (\$91,024).

Overtime Compensation

 One-third continue to not receive any compensation for working overtime, particularly advanced level engineers (47% do not receive overtime remuneration). Around onethird overall receive a combination of pay and time off for working overtime, particularly those working in the public sector (42%).



Satisfaction with Remuneration

- Overall, satisfaction with remuneration has remained quite stable over the past five years. Seven in 10 continue to be satisfied with their level of remuneration (73% vs. 71% satisfied in 2024) although those who are very satisfied still do not reach 50 per cent.
- Satisfaction is correlated with the levels of experience held by engineers. Lower-level engineers are less satisfied than their higher-level counterparts (66% satisfied among entry level and 67% among junior levels vs. 77% among intermediate and 79% among advanced level engineers).

Salary Increases

- Salary increases are similar to those received in 2023. Overall, four in five received at least one salary adjustment in 2024 that included a net salary percentage increase of 6.6 per cent (down slightly from 6.3% in 2023). entry level and junior level engineers received the highest salary increases among their cohorts (8.6% and 8.5% respectively).
- Those working in the private sector received a higher salary increase than those in the public sector (6.9% vs. 5.6%) as did women (7.2% increase vs. 6.4% among their male counterparts).
- Two-thirds received their increase based on merit with one in five receiving a cost-of-living increase.
- A very small number experienced a decrease in salary, mostly due to economic factors or changing employers.



Full-Time Remuneration

- The average base salary plus bonuses, overtime and other financial compensation (including commissions) for those reporting a full-time salary in 2024 is \$118,897 (up from \$114,937 in 2023), with the median total salary of \$108,395.
- Full-time gross salaries for 2024 reported include:
 - Entry Level: \$78,940 (similar to 2023 at \$78,165) with a base salary of \$74,377 and a median salary of \$73,000.
 - Junior Level: \$102,911 (up from \$98,931 in 2023) with a base salary of \$93,408 and a median salary of \$92,000.
 - Intermediate Level: \$129,976 (up from \$123,653 in 2023) with a base salary of \$118,432 and a median salary of \$115,000.
 - Advanced Level: \$163,233 (up from \$157,433 in 2023) with a base salary of \$141,736 and a median salary of \$134,553.

- Overall, those working in the private sector earn a higher gross salary than those working in the public sector (\$120,044 vs. \$116,649) although it's reversed when we compare the average median salaries (\$115,000 public sector vs. \$104,792 private sector).
- The gross salaries of engineers/geoscientists working in the educational/non-profit sectors are closer to those in the private sector (\$113,197 gross average salary).
- Gender-wise, men continue to earn around 15 per cent more than their female counterparts. Men on average earn \$122,265 (gross average salary) compared to women's gross average salary of \$105,896. This disparity is most acute when examining bonuses. Here, men receive slightly more than twice as much as women (\$8,776 vs. \$3,541 for women).
- Hourly rates for those working full-time average \$53.71/hour (rising to \$66.03/hour for advanced level engineers).



Part-Time Remuneration and Working Weeks

- Overall, the average base salary reported for part-time engineers/ geoscientists is \$57,324. (Note that this data is based on a very small sample of 14 respondents and is therefore not comparable to 2023.)
- Overall, those working part-time average 38.71 weeks per year.

Vacation and Sick Days

- Virtually all receive paid vacation time, although slightly fewer overall receive paid sick days. Most notably, just slightly more than one in 10 entry level engineers (11%) and those who work in the private sector (13%) do not receive paid sick days.
- Overall, engineers/geoscientists average 19 days of paid vacation a year (rising to 23 days for advanced level engineers).
- Three in five receive paid vacation only while around one-third were able to receive both vacation pay and flex time off.

Paid Benefits

- Nearly all are eligible to receive benefits in 2024.
- There is very little change in 2024 regarding the type and cost-split of paid benefits offered, compared to 2023.

- Around one-half of respondents share the costs of their dental, drug and extended health plans with their employers, although those working in the public sector are more likely to have these benefits paid exclusively by their employer.
- More than one-half share the costs of a pension plan and RRSPs, while a majority (65%) do not have any stock purchase options through their employer.
- Life insurance and long-term disability are most likely to be a shared expense between employer/employee. However, public sector employees are more likely to have their employer pay for their short and long-term disability insurance.
- Parental leave EI top-up, on the other hand, is not offered as a benefit for one-quarter of engineers. Two in five are unsure if their employer offers maternity/adoption leave.
- A majority of employers pay for professional development courses including continuing education (52%) and job training (81%).
- In terms of professional dues, 82 per cent have their professional dues paid by their employer and 57 per cent have technical society dues paid by their employers (rising to 67% among advanced level engineers).

Benefits Offered by Employers

- Around one-quarter of engineers (especially those working in the private sector) are offered additional financial benefits including profit sharing (26%), a savings plan (31%), a productivity incentive or a corporate share dividend (16% each).
- Flexible work hours (78%) and leaves of absence (57%) are offered by a majority of employers, although job sharing is less apparent (10%).
- Vehicles (10%) and vehicle allowances (21%) are provided by far fewer employers, although four in 10 have paid parking provided. Nearly three in 10 of those who work in the public sector have a vehicle allowance offered by their employers.
- Cell phone reimbursement is paid by three in five employers with far fewer entry level engineers having this benefit provided, compared to advanced level engineers (44% vs. 77%).

- Parental leave is offered by around one-half of employers (52%) while daycare is offered by only one per cent of employers (rising to a high of 9% among those in the educational/non-profit sectors). Two-thirds of those who work in the public sector as well as women have parental leave offered through their employer.
- Liability insurance is a benefit provided by one-third of employers. Advanced level engineers are far more likely to have this benefit as part of their employment package compared to entry level engineers (46% vs. 21%).



Roles and Responsibilities

- There is very little difference noted in 2024 in the number of engineers/geoscientists in specific roles and areas of responsibilities, compared to 2023.
- Three in 10 describe their overall range of duties as being a fully qualified professional, with only four per cent in the "early training" phase and one per cent at the upper end of the duties, describing their role as a CEO.
- One-quarter identify their level of responsibility as making functional decisions while seven per cent are at the lowest level – only making routine decisions and two per cent at the upper end – making strategic decisions.
- In terms of the level of supervision received, 38 per cent indicate they work towards objectives to be accomplished independently while two per cent are still working under close supervision and three per cent determine policies, plans and programs.

- Fifteen per cent do not have a supervisory or leadership role at all, while a plurality of one-third describe themselves as an individual contributor. Senior leaders/executives make up 10 per cent of respondents.
- Very few engineers/geoscientists supervise more than 50 others.
- Twelve per cent regularly/frequently use their professional seal, rising to around two in 10 among intermediate level engineers.



Methodology

Research Objectives

Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba conducted an online survey among its engineer and geoscience members. The purpose of the research was to collect information on the salary and compensation packages provided by employers for 2024. Probe Research Inc. was retained to review and develop the survey, analyze the data and report on the findings.

Methodology

An online survey was administered and made available by Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba to its members via their database portal. Notice of the survey was sent by bulk email to the members who had opted in to the 'Enews Consent' mailing list.

The survey was available for completion from April 10, 2025 to May 12, 2025.

A total of 1,135 members fully or partially completed the survey out of 6,680 eligible candidates, for a response rate of 17% (up slightly from 16% in 2023). It should be noted that those who completed either the salary and/or only other sections of the survey are included in these results, therefore bases may vary.

Sample

The survey was offered to all interns, members and specified scope of practice licensees, who live and work in Manitoba, targeting those who earned a salary in Manitoba in the 2024 year. Self-employed engineers/geoscientists are not included in these results.

With a sample of 1,135 eligible engineers/geoscientists, the margin of error is \pm 2.65 percentage points, 19 times out of 20 (finite population correction).



Experience Level Definitions

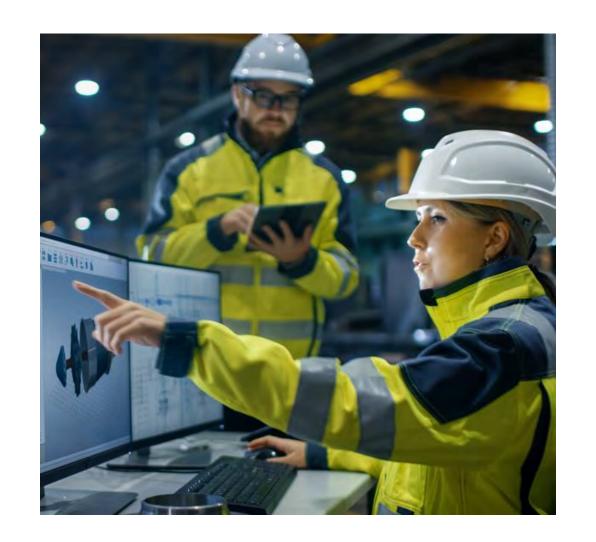
Below are the definitions used to describe the four levels of engineers/geoscientists as of December 31, 2024 who participated in this research:

Entry Level: This includes engineering/geoscience interns (EIT/GIT) who have not yet received their professional designation and/or who have 1-4 years of experience after graduation.

Junior Level: This includes engineers/geoscientists with a professional designation (P.Eng./P.Geo.) and who have 5-9 years of experience after graduation.

Intermediate Level: This includes engineers/geoscientists with a professional designation (P.Eng./P.Geo.) and 10-19 years of experience after graduation.

Advanced Level: This includes engineers/geoscientists with a professional designation (P.Eng./P.Geo.) and 20+ years of experience after graduation.

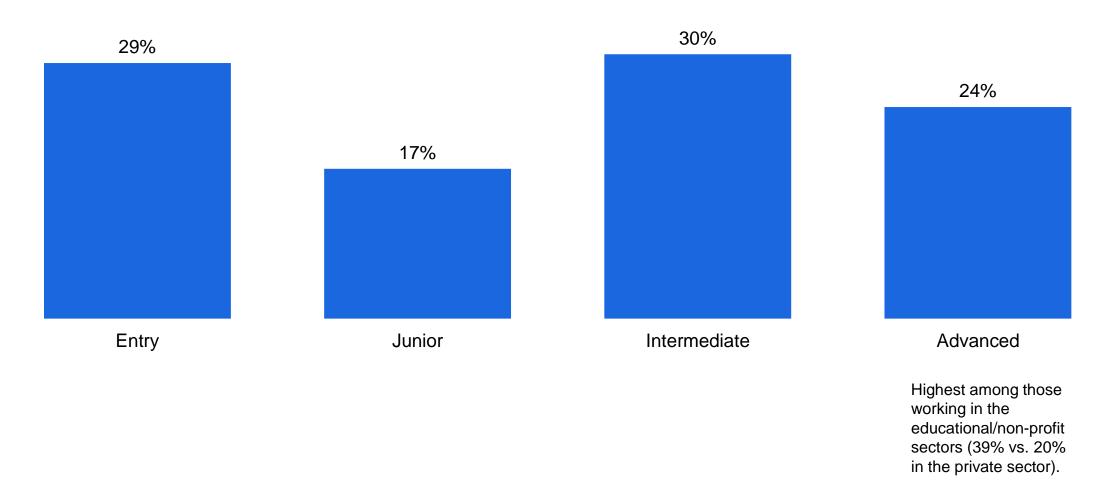

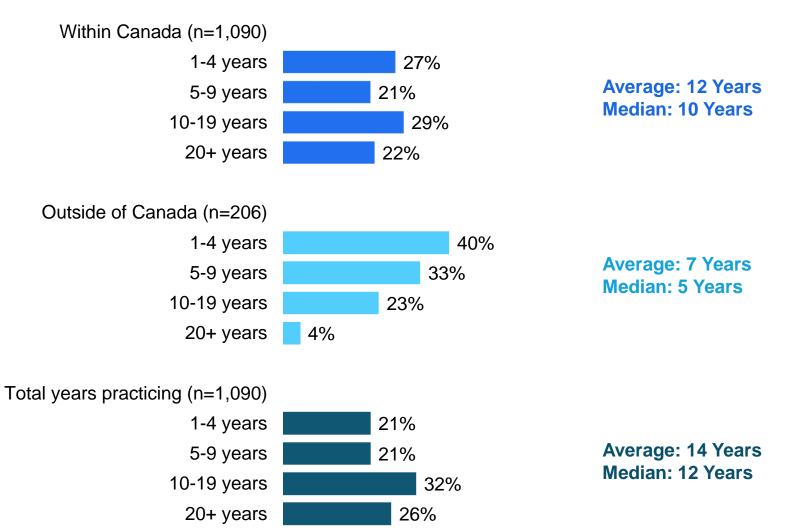
Level of Experience

Which of the following best describes your level of experience as of December 31, 2024? (Base: Those responding, n=1,058)



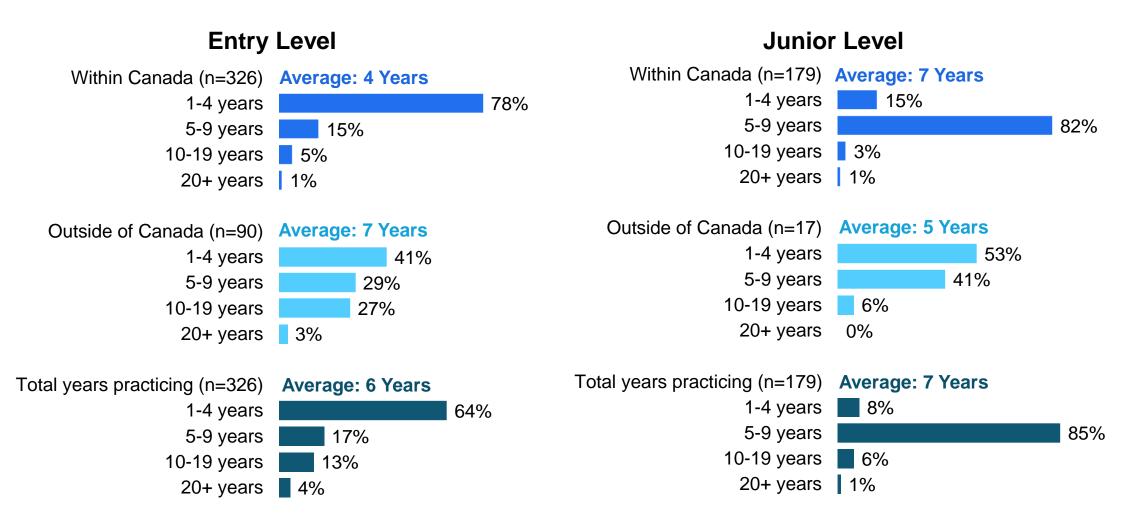
Years Practicing: By Location

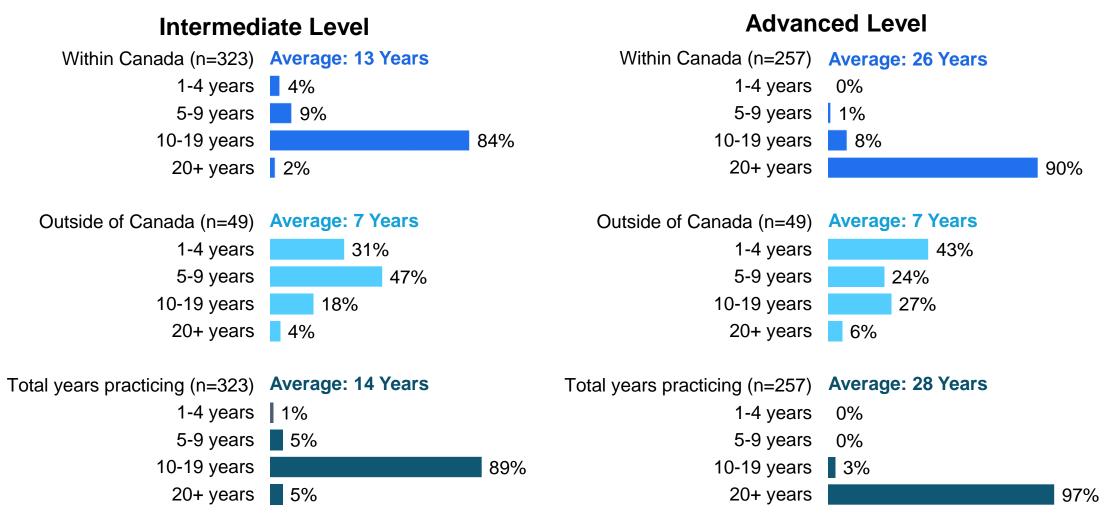
Years Practicing: By Entry and Junior Levels

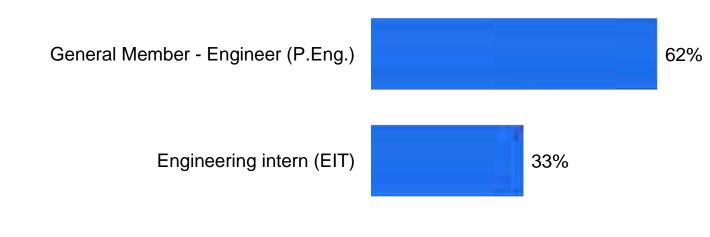
Years Practicing: By Intermediate and Advanced Levels

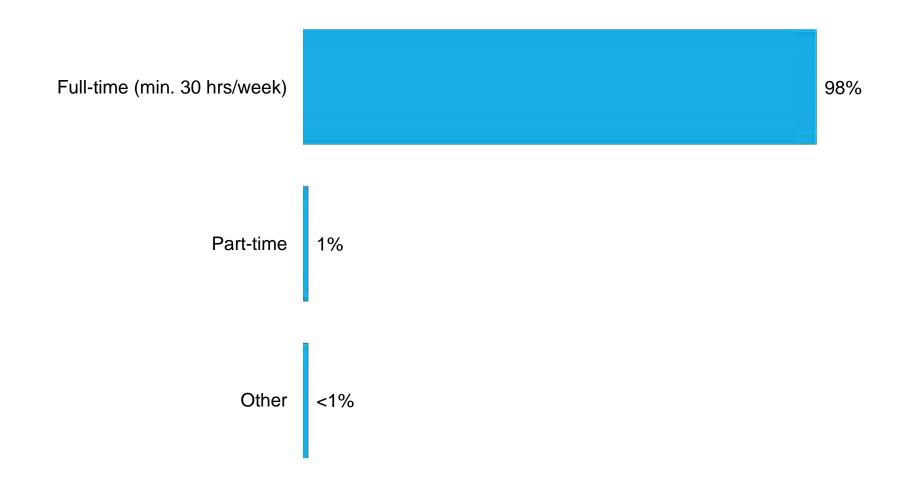

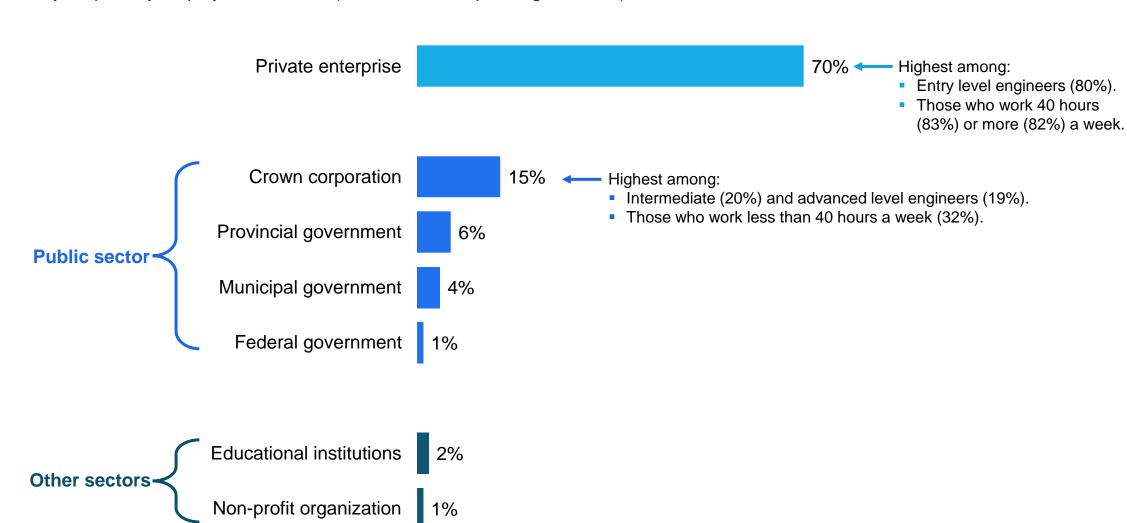
Employment Status

What is your employment status as of December 31, 2024? (Base: Those responding, n=1,096)



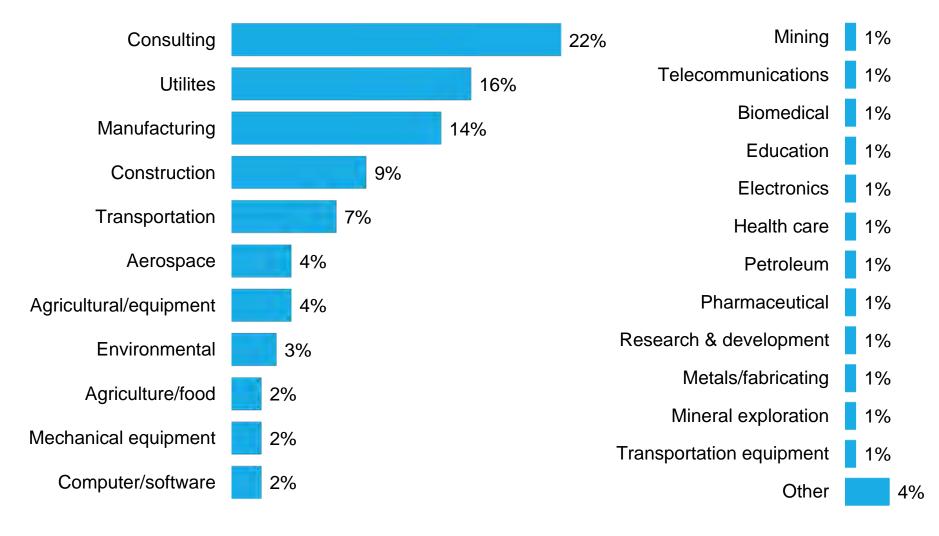
Primary Employment Sector

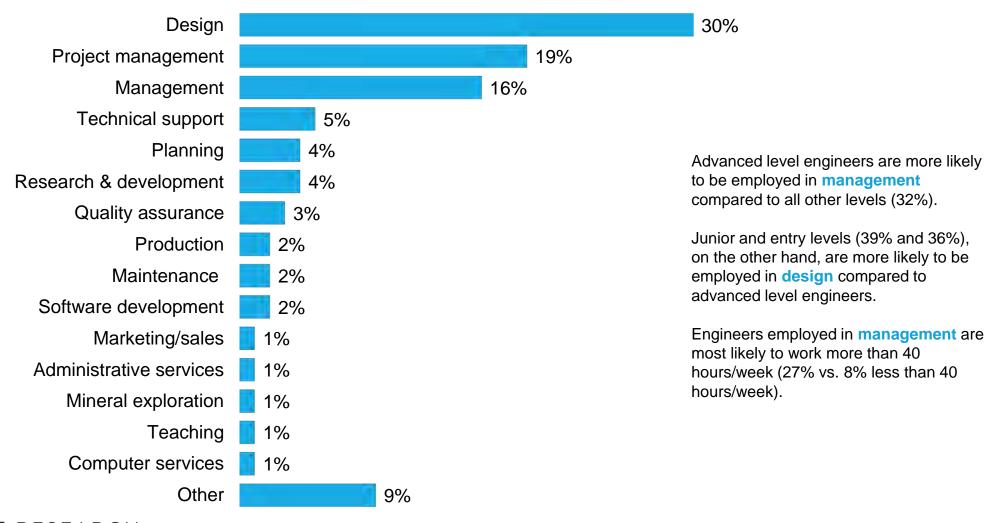

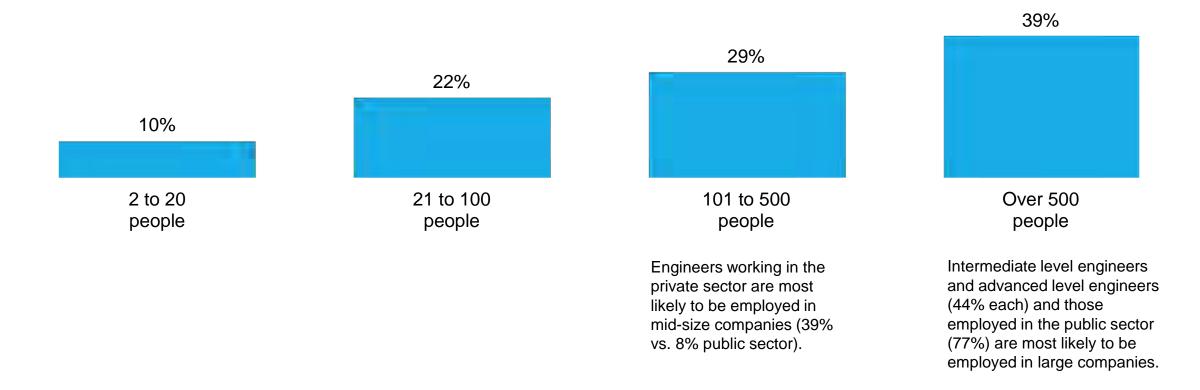
Principal Job Function

What is your principal job function (check all that apply)? And which is your principal job function, that is the one where you spend most of your working time? Please select one only. (Base: Those responding, n=1,087)



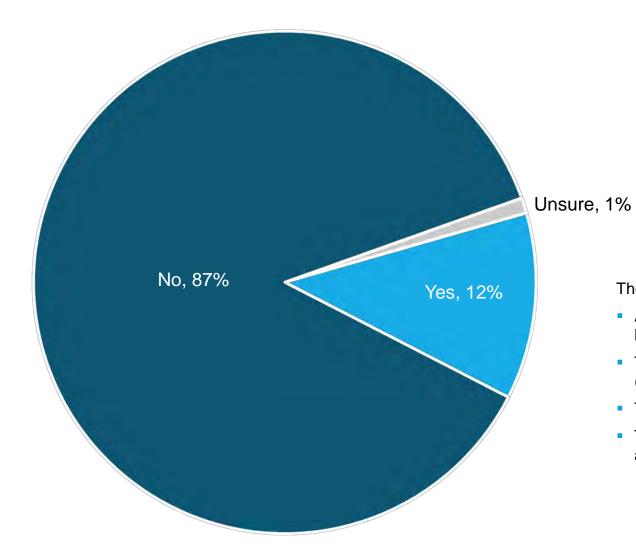
Size of Manitoba Employer

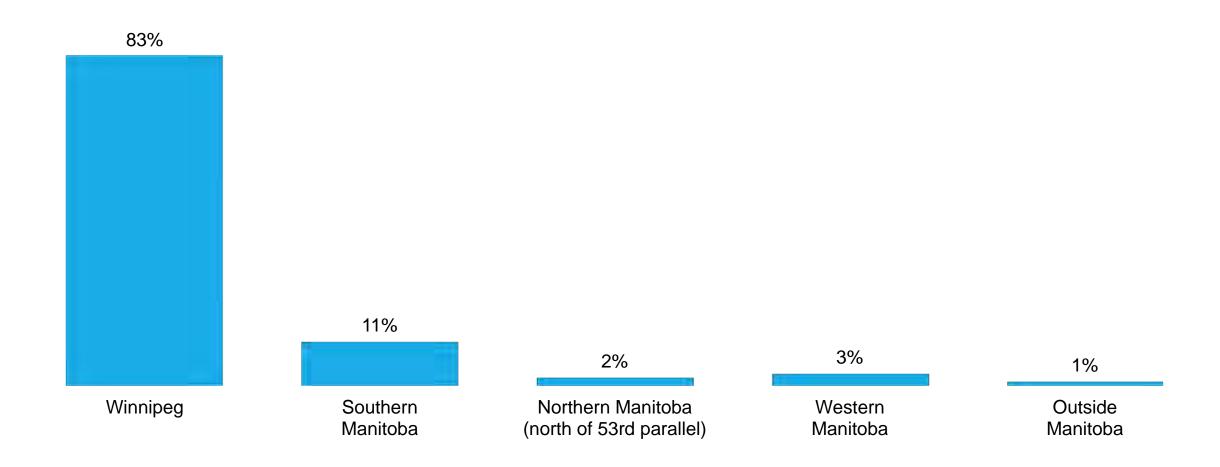

Where is your principal work location? (Those responding, n=1,087)



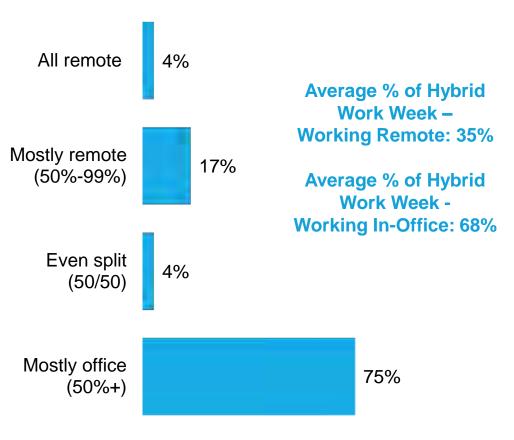
Incidence of Remote/Hybrid Work

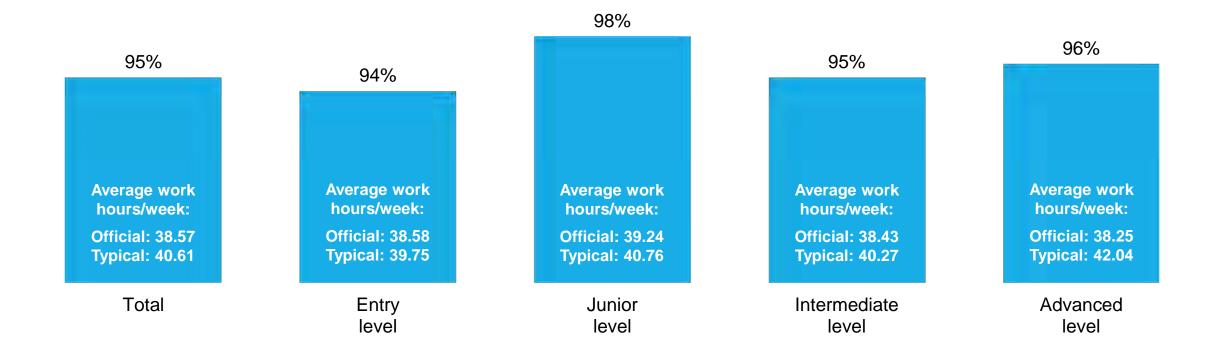

Do you have an official work week? (Base: Those with an official work week, n=1,059)

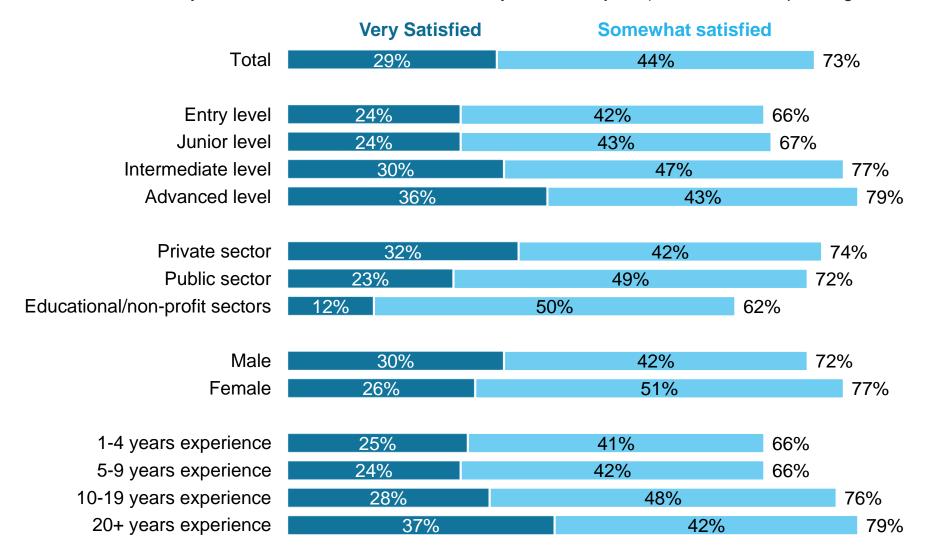

Overall, how satisfied are you with the level of remuneration for your current job? (Base: Those responding, n=1,046)

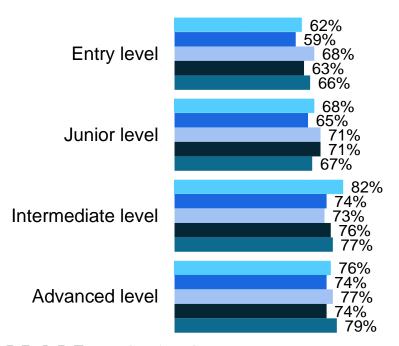


Overall Satisfaction with Remuneration: Tracking

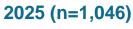

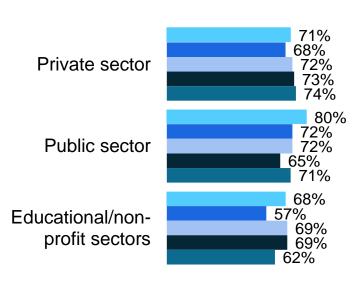

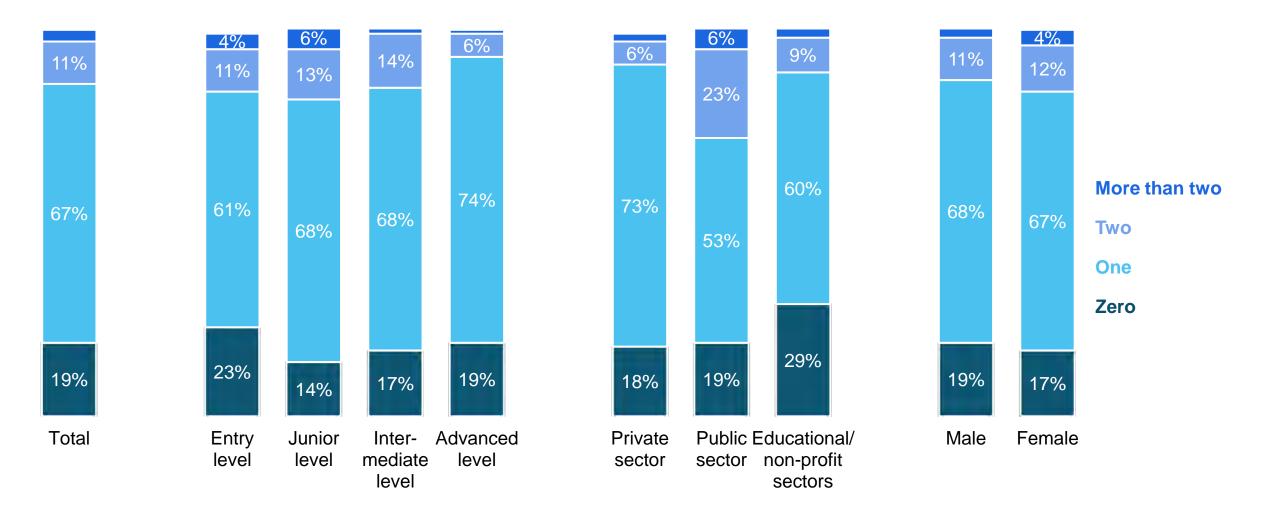

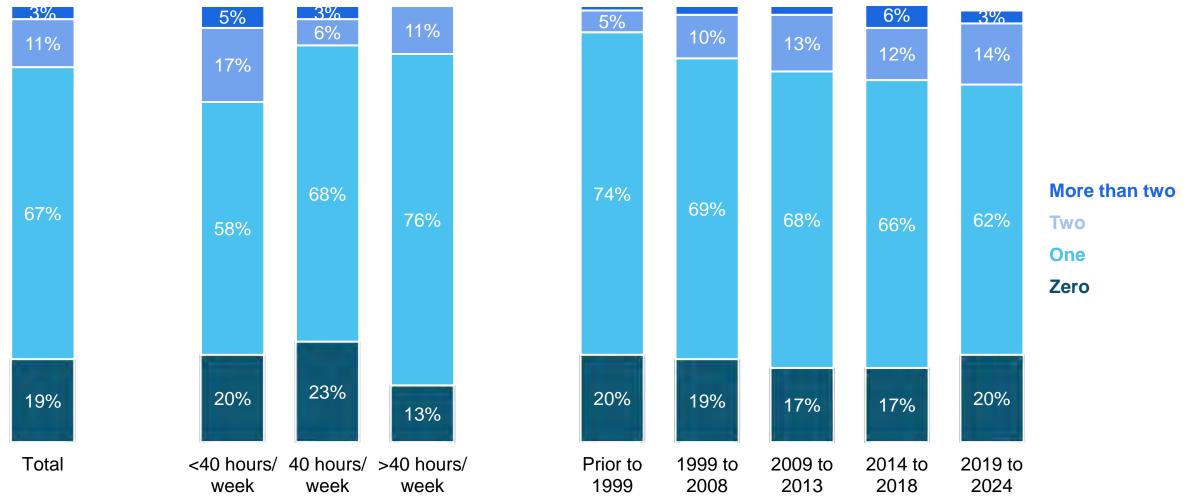

Base Salary Adjustments: By Hours Worked and Grad Year

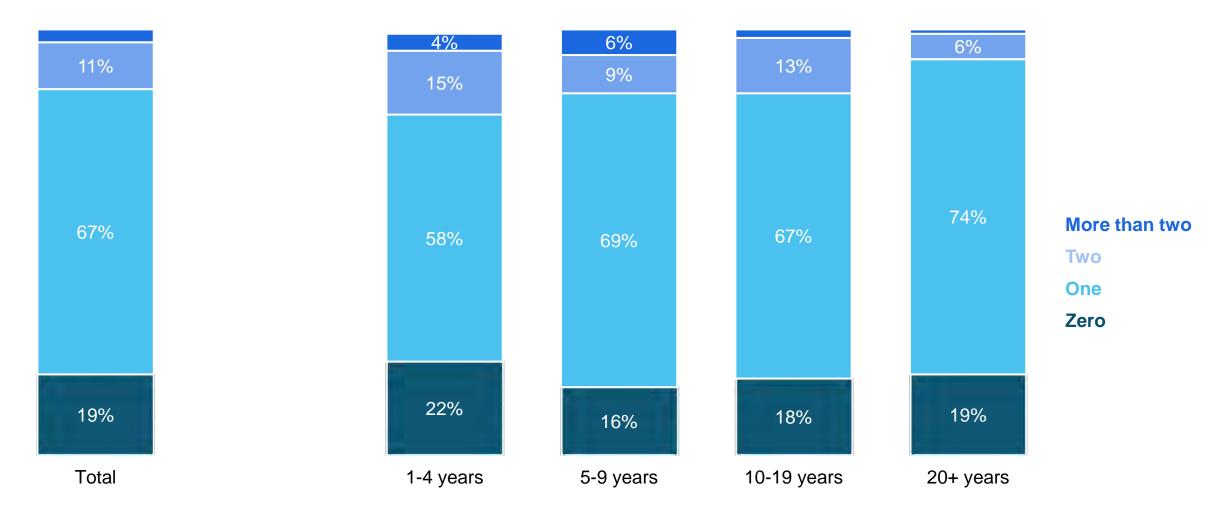

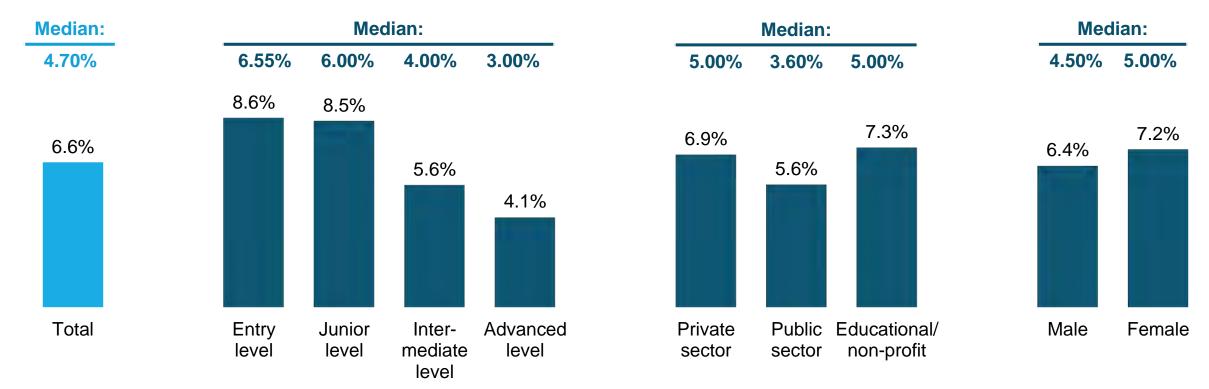

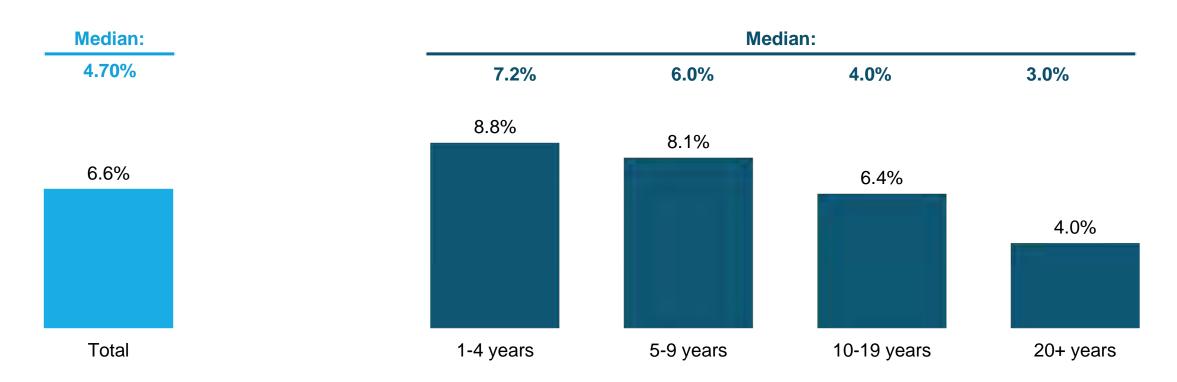

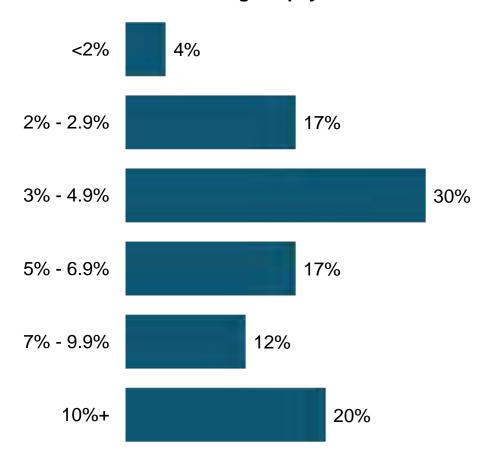

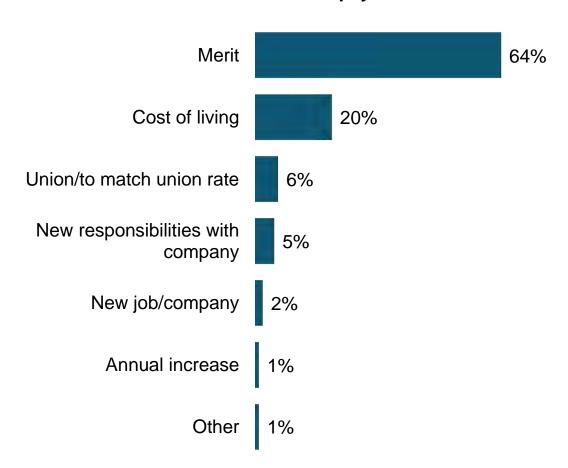

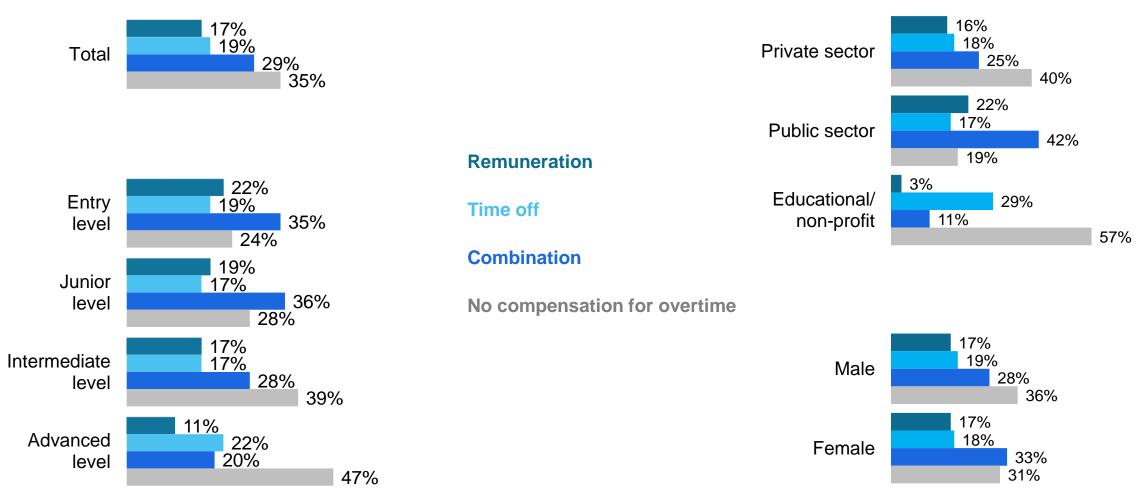

Type of Overtime Compensation: By Experience, Sector and Gender

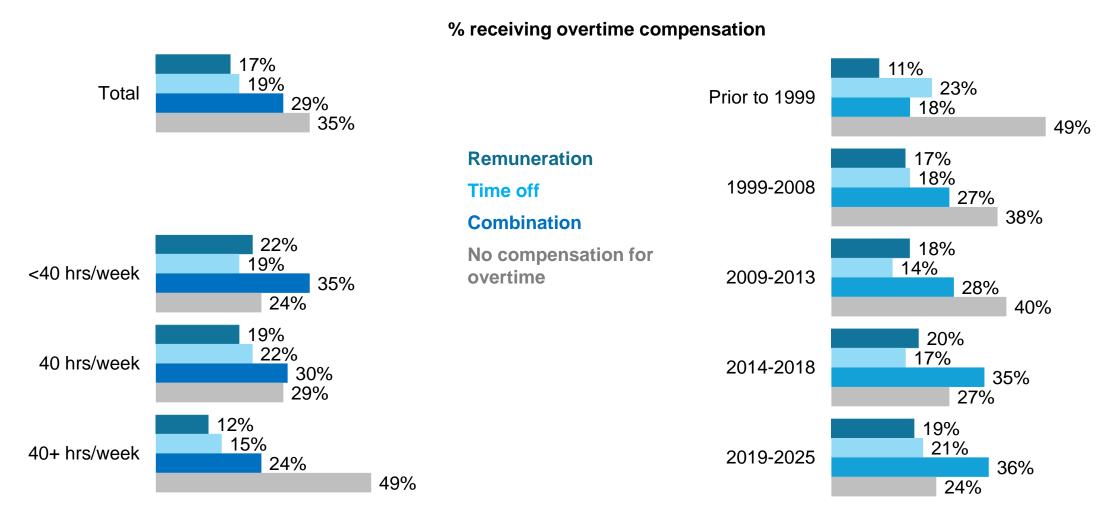

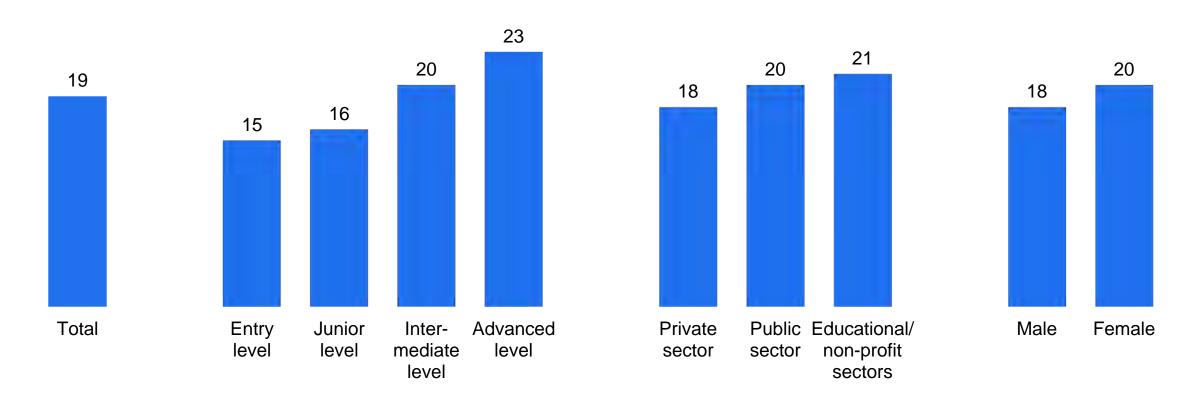




Paid Vacation Days: By Experience, Sector and Gender

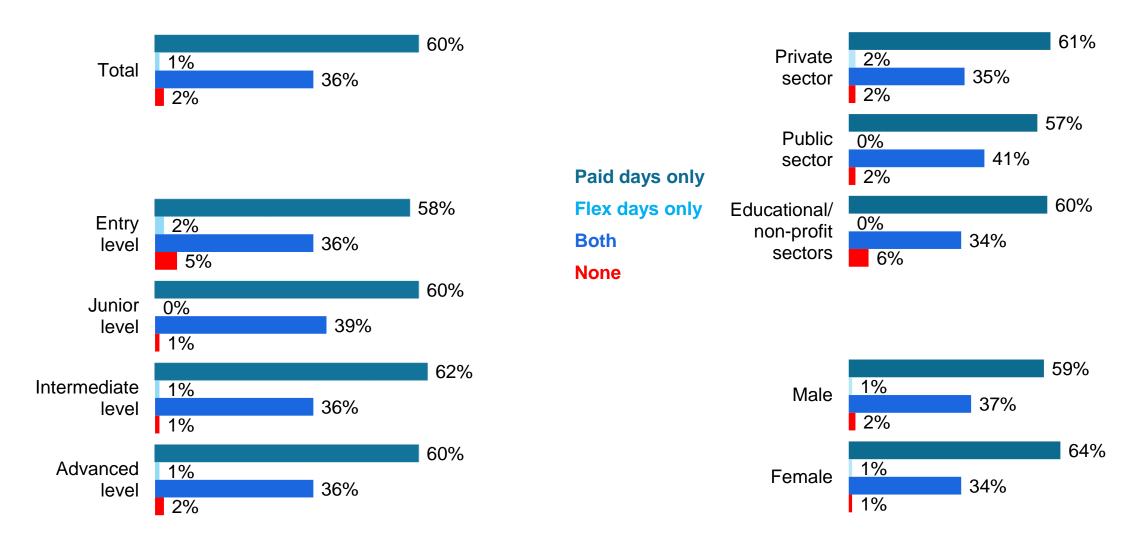

Type of Vacation: By Experience, Sector and Gender

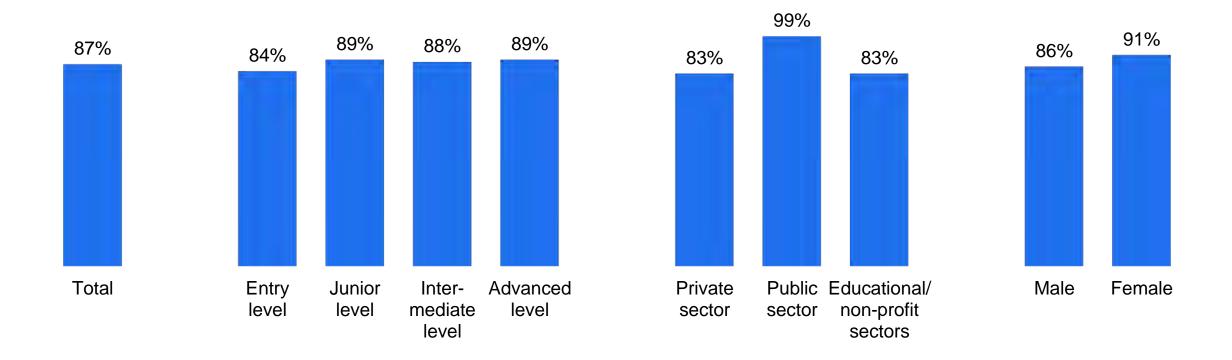

Paid Sick Time: By Experience, Organizational Sector and Gender

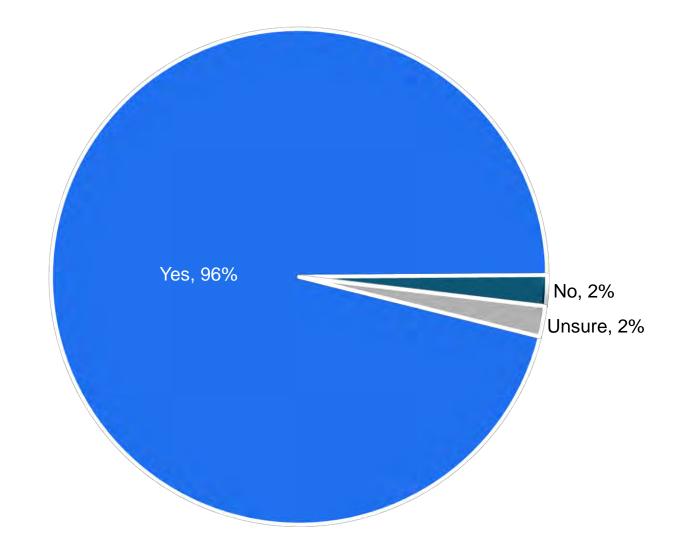

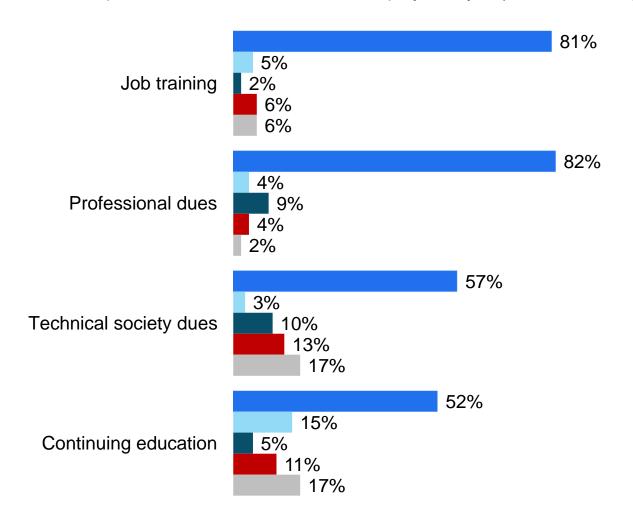

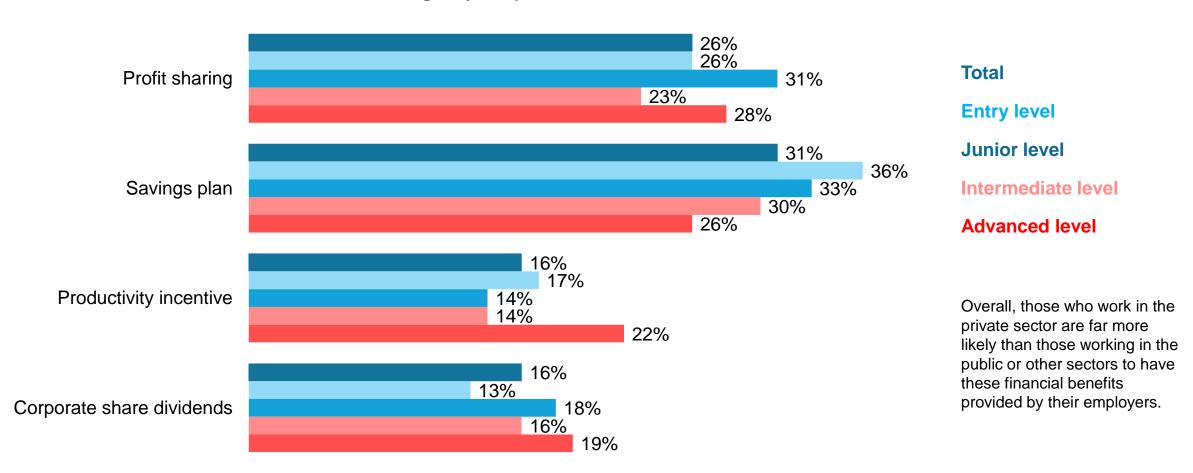

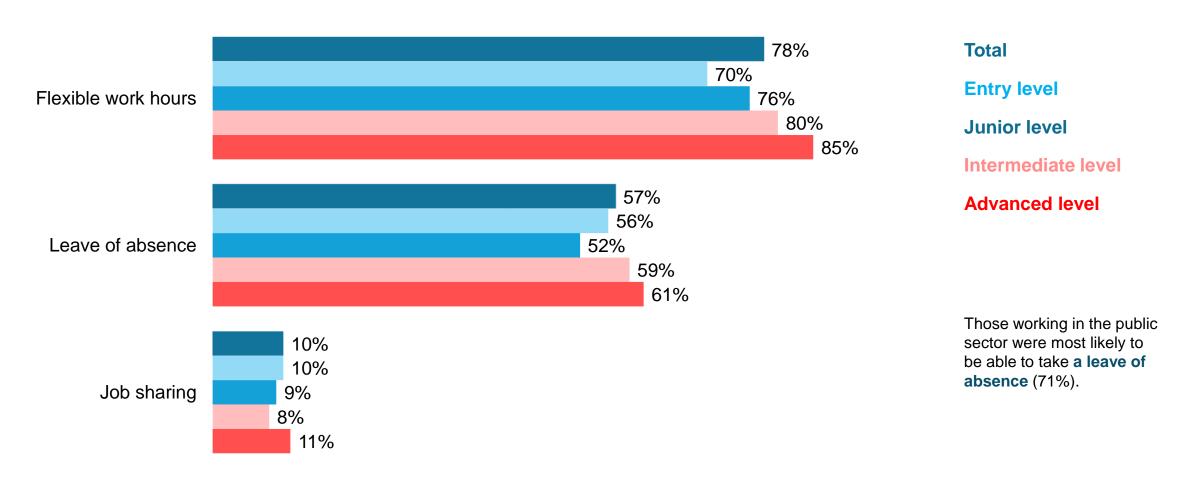

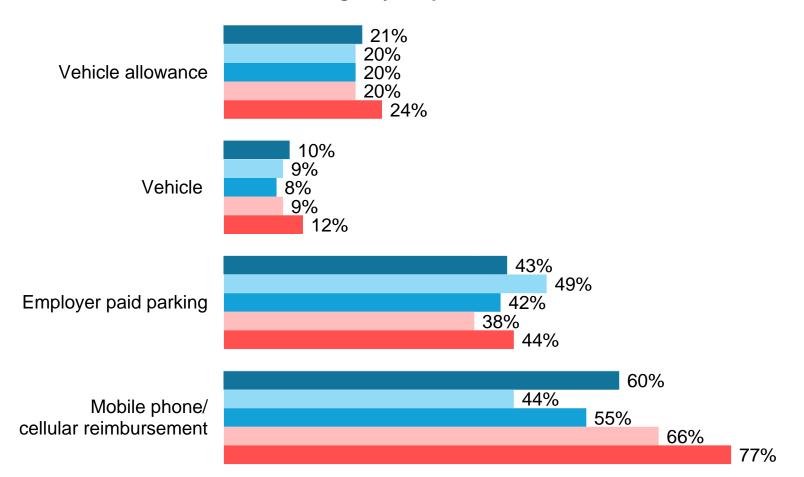

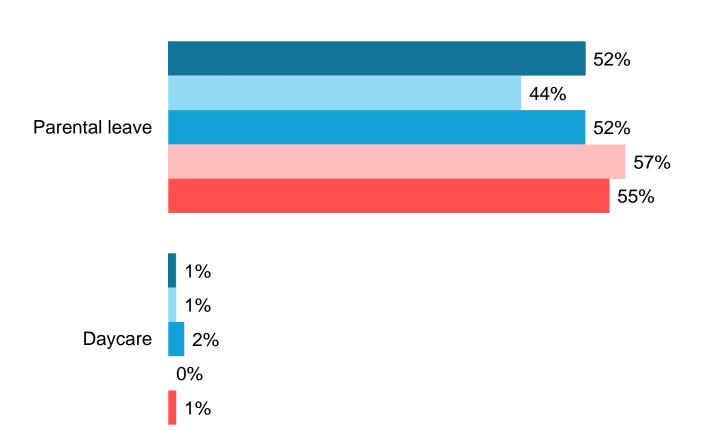

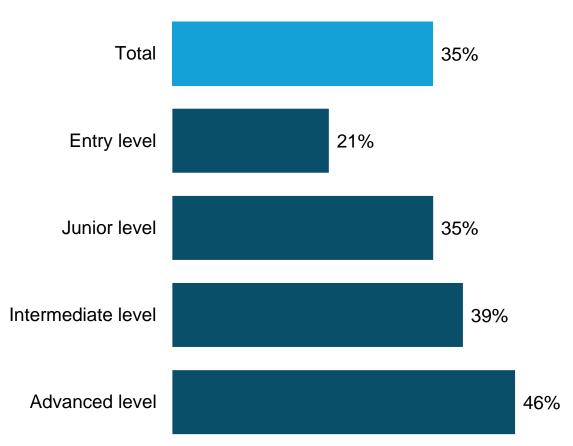

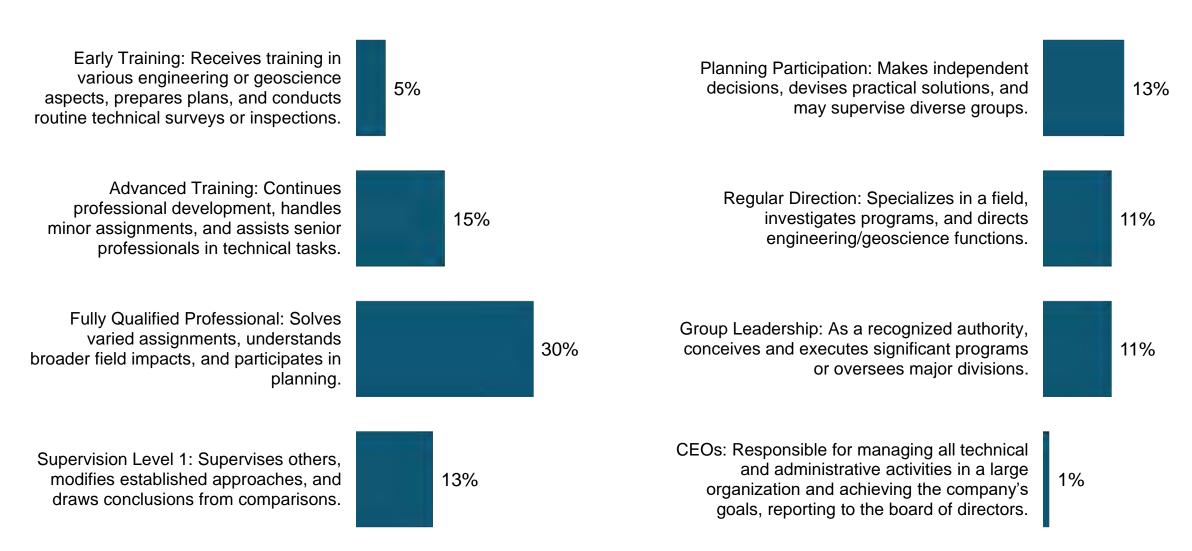

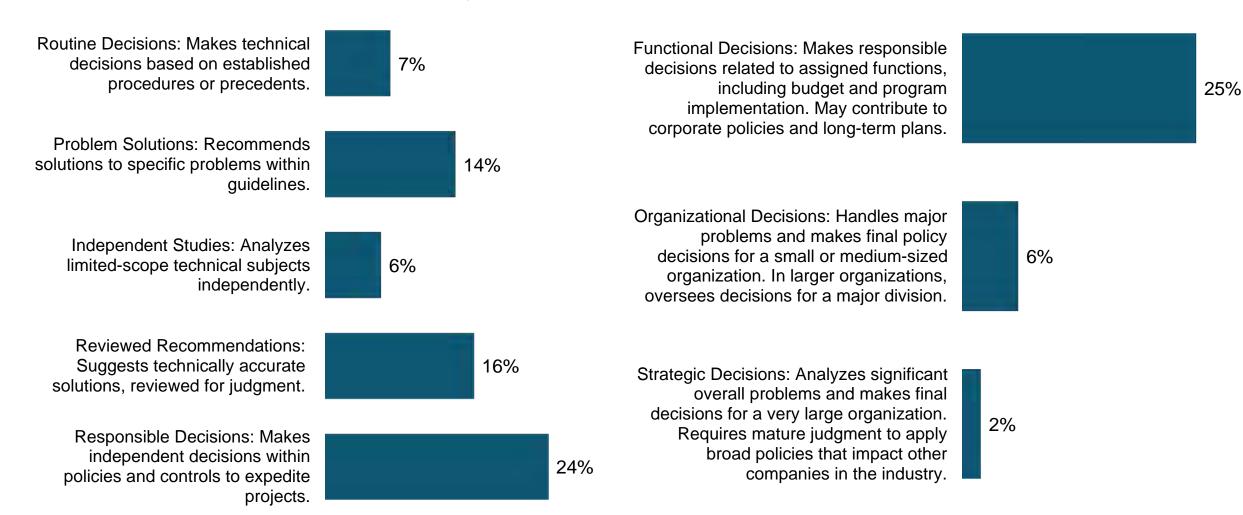
Overall Range of Duties: By Level of Experience

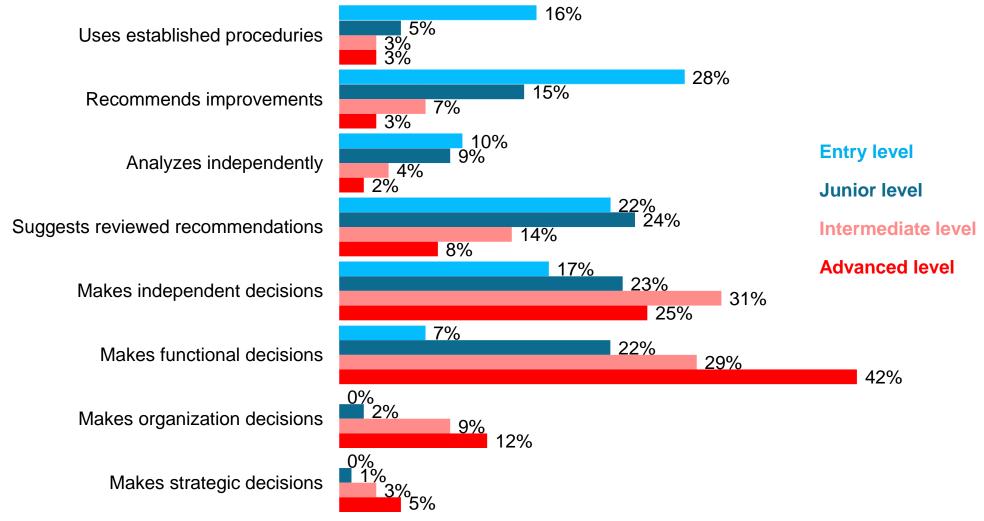

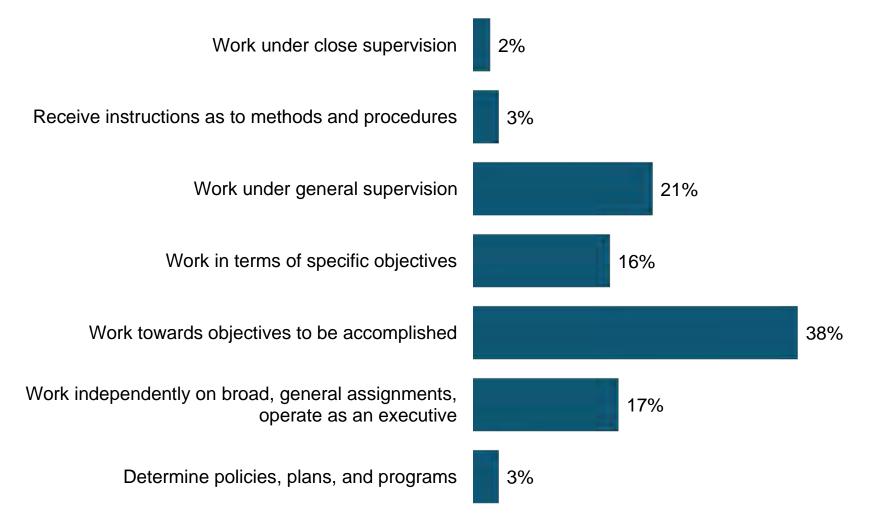

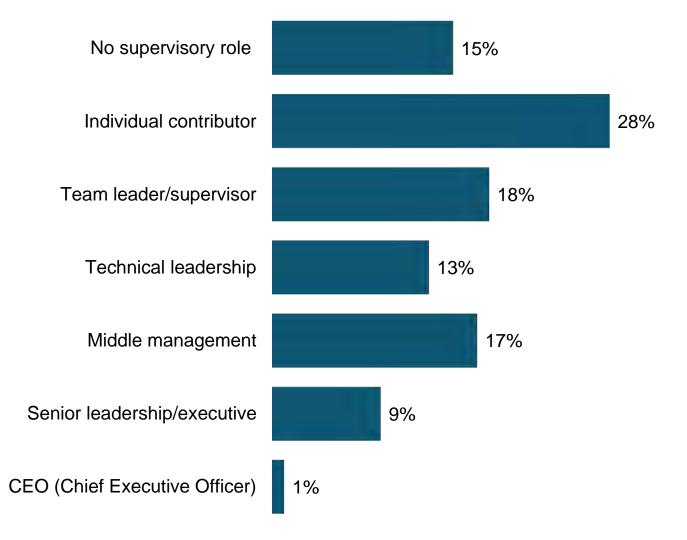

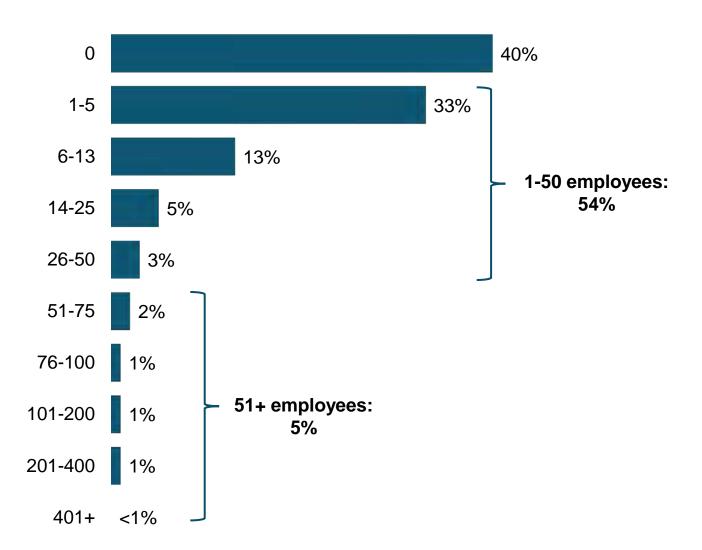

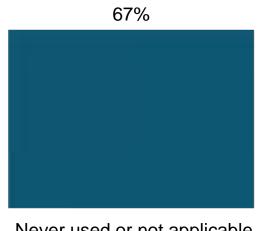

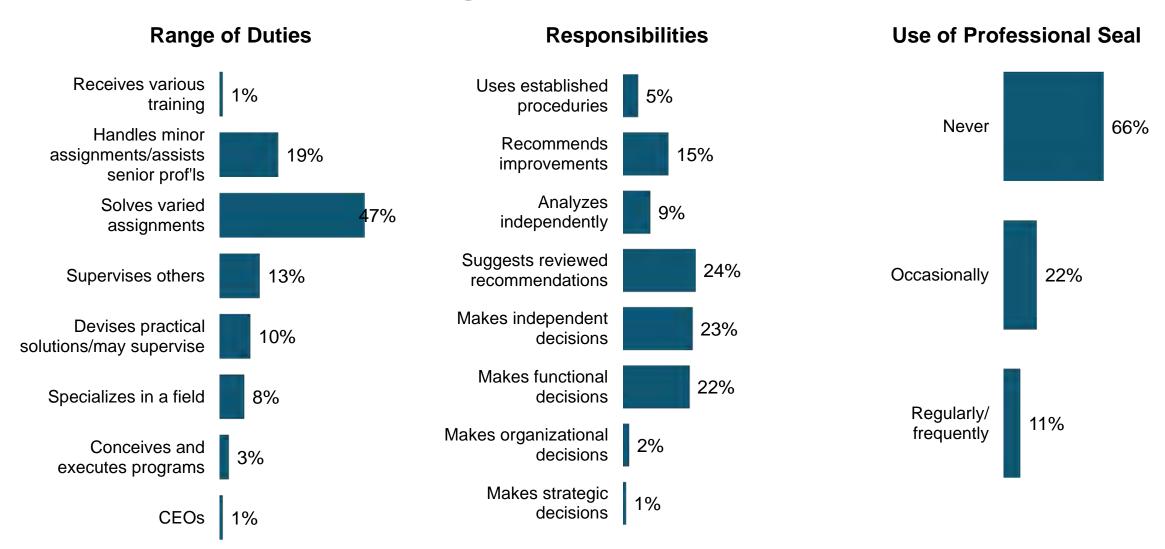

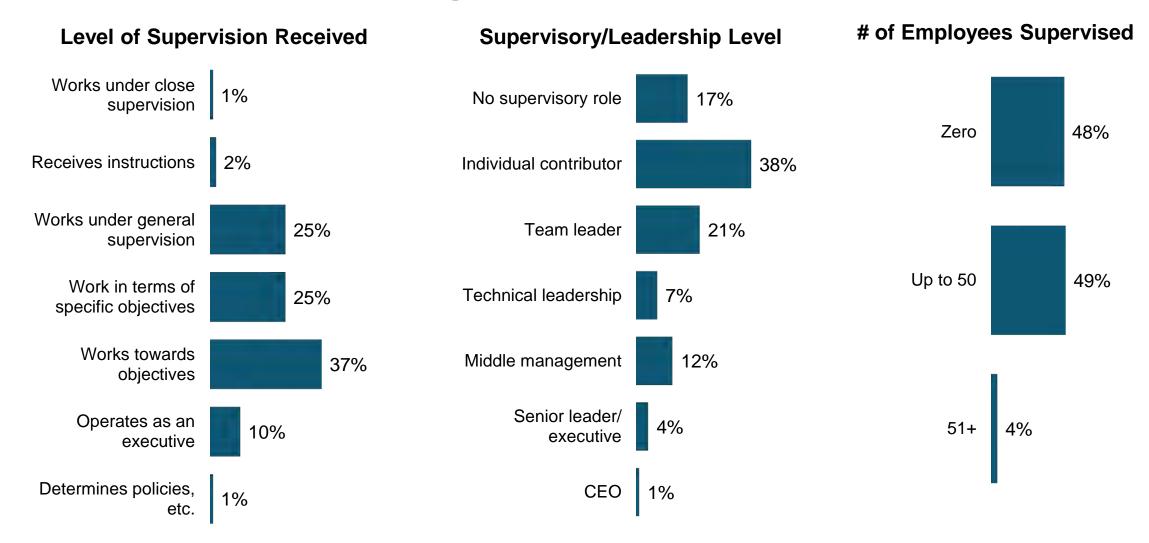
Summary of Junior Level Engineers: Roles and Responsibilities

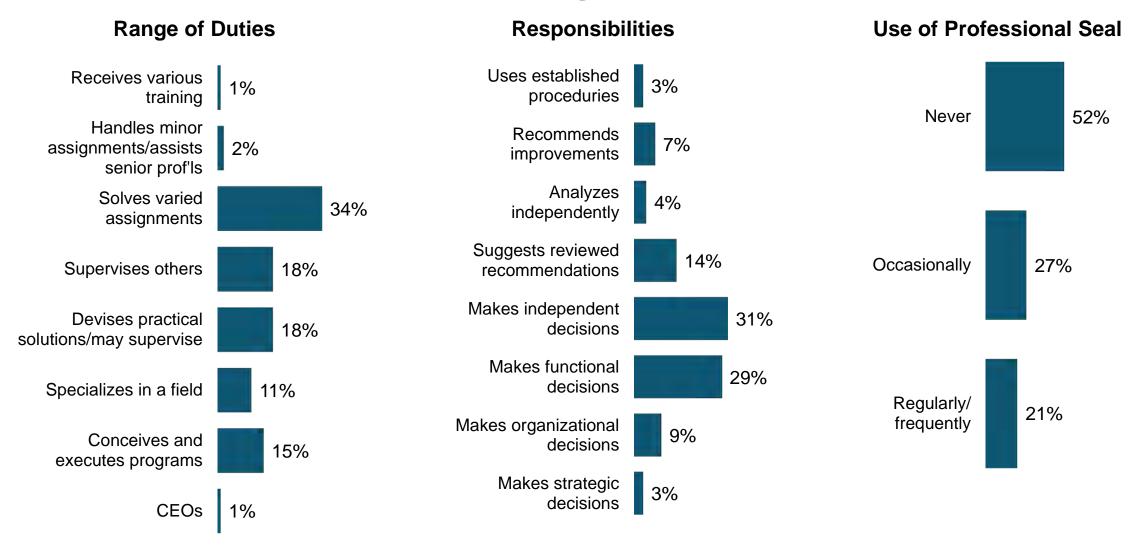

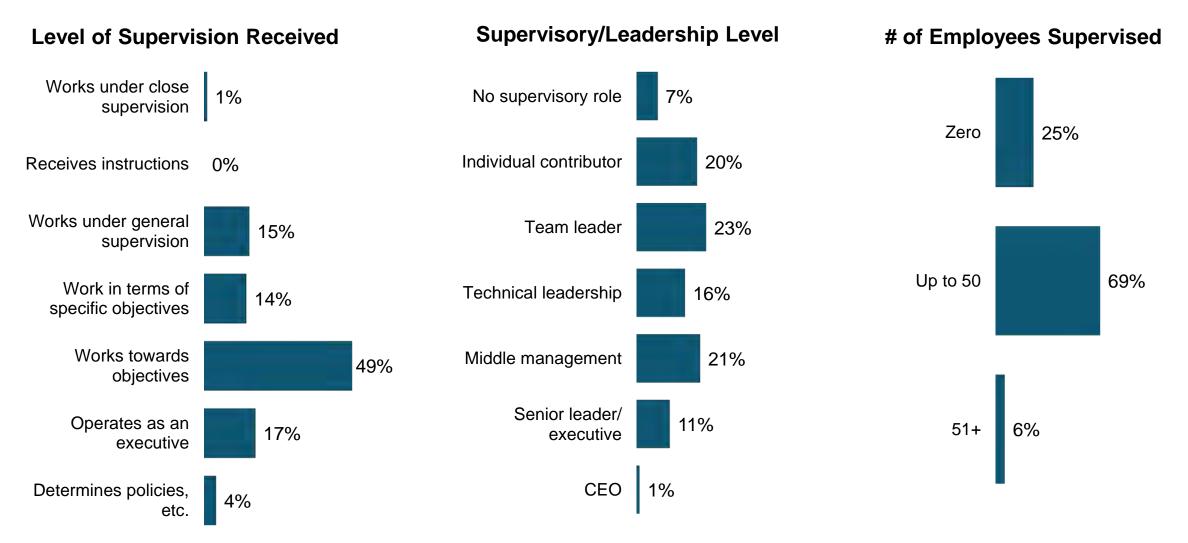

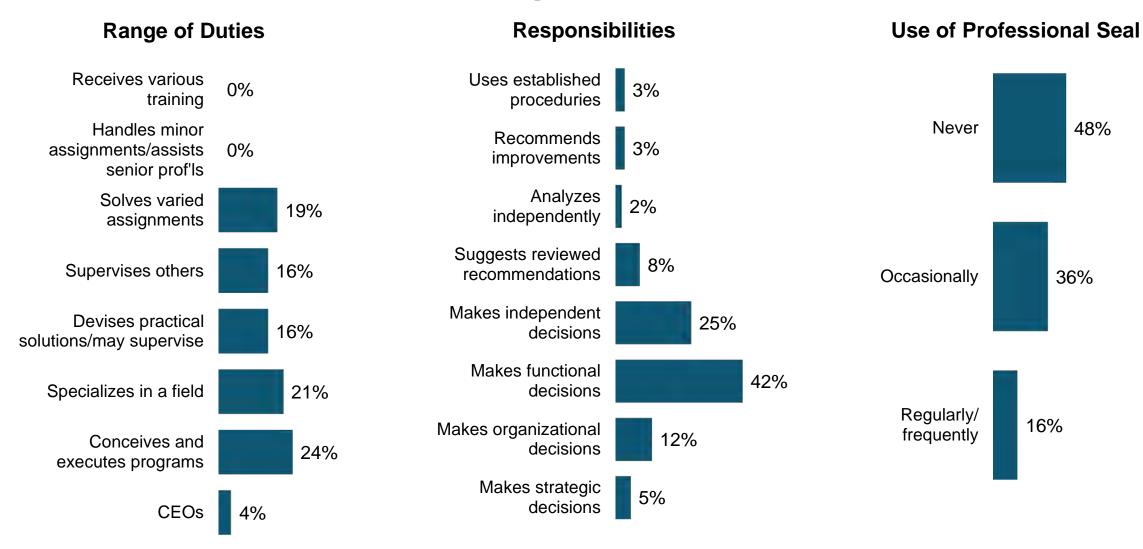

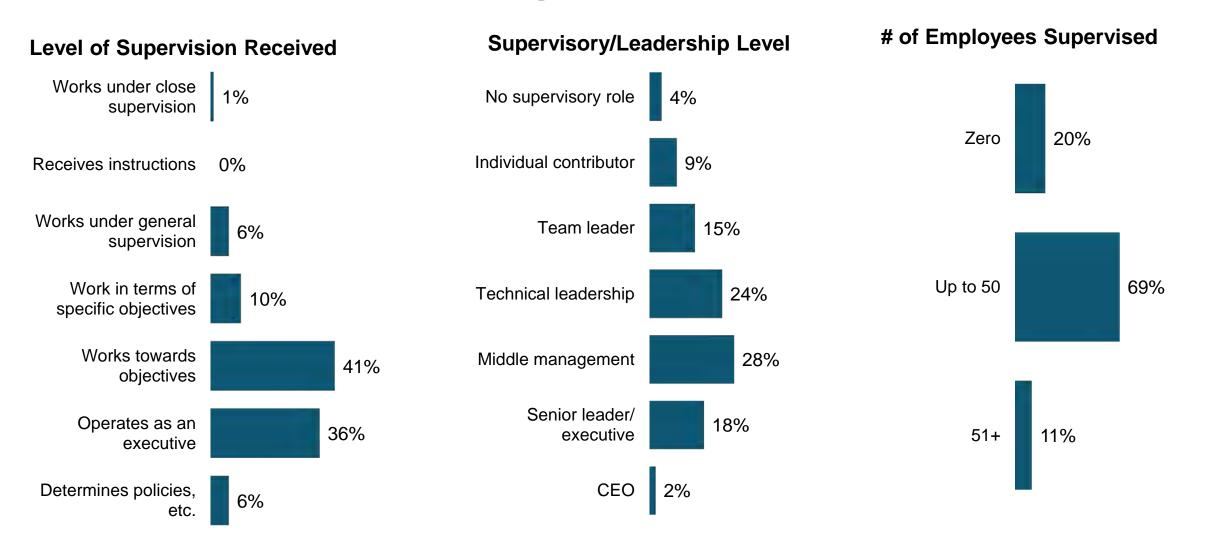


Summary of Advanced Level Engineers: Roles and Responsibilities
