About the Opportunity

- Designing wastewater conveyance infrastructure, including gravity and pressurized networks, force mains, and pumping facilities such as lift stations.
- Designing stormwater infrastructure, including overland and piped drainage systems and stormwater management facilities (e.g., dry ponds, wet ponds, constructed wetlands and Low Impact Development techniques).
- Develop flood inundation and flood hazard mapping and conduct a variety of river engineering designs (e.g., erosion protection, flood mitigation).
- Technical writing to document design assumptions, methodologies, and findings, clearly conveying the implications of the design to the client.

In addition to becoming part of the Water Practice team, you will remain an integral part of the overall Edmonton Engineering Team, for which you will be expected to:

- Apply theory and provide workable solutions related to the design and implementation of horizontal infrastructure for Municipalities and Indigenous Communities.
- Act as the clients' representative on-site during construction to gather information, conduct inspections and ensure designs are built to specifications.
- Build and grow relationships with existing project leaders and clients.
- Communicate professionally and proactively with contractors, co-workers, clients, and the general public.
